

Student Expectations for Remote Teaching and Learning

As we move forward into the Remote Model, it is important that we outline the expectations for students. The following expectations are fluid and they may change and evolve over time given our resources in an ever changing environment.

Student Expectations for Remote Instruction

Google Classroom will be used for a variety of purposes that may include but are not limited to demonstrations; document posting/sharing; discussion forum assignments with virtual dialogue, generating and responding to questions/comments; document-based exercises; reading and responding; and PowerPoint/Google Slides presentations (with notes with embedded videos, links, and information on topics).

Google Meet will be utilized for direct synchronous instruction on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Wednesdays will be utilized for office hours only and student support as needed. No new instruction will be given on Wednesdays.

- Students should check emails and google classrooms each day.
- Students must log on to each teacher's google meet and follow their schedule and participate in 30 minutes of synchronous instruction through google meet for each class on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. All classes will meet on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
- Wednesdays will be for office hours only and student support as needed. No new instruction will be given on Wednesdays.
- Students will get a "free period" to work on assignments during a scheduled study hall.
- Students will have videos on unless the classroom teacher informs them to have them off.
- Students should wear clothing that is appropriate for school.
- Students should use language that would be appropriate in a school setting.
- Students should be on time and ready to participate.
- Students should be in an environment conducive for learning, such as at a desk or table or sitting on a couch or chair.
- Students should use their own name when signing in to the conference.
- Students should check that the background appearing on screen is free of any items that would not be appropriate in a school setting.
- Students should be aware of background noise and use a headset when necessary to prevent disrupting the google meet.
