

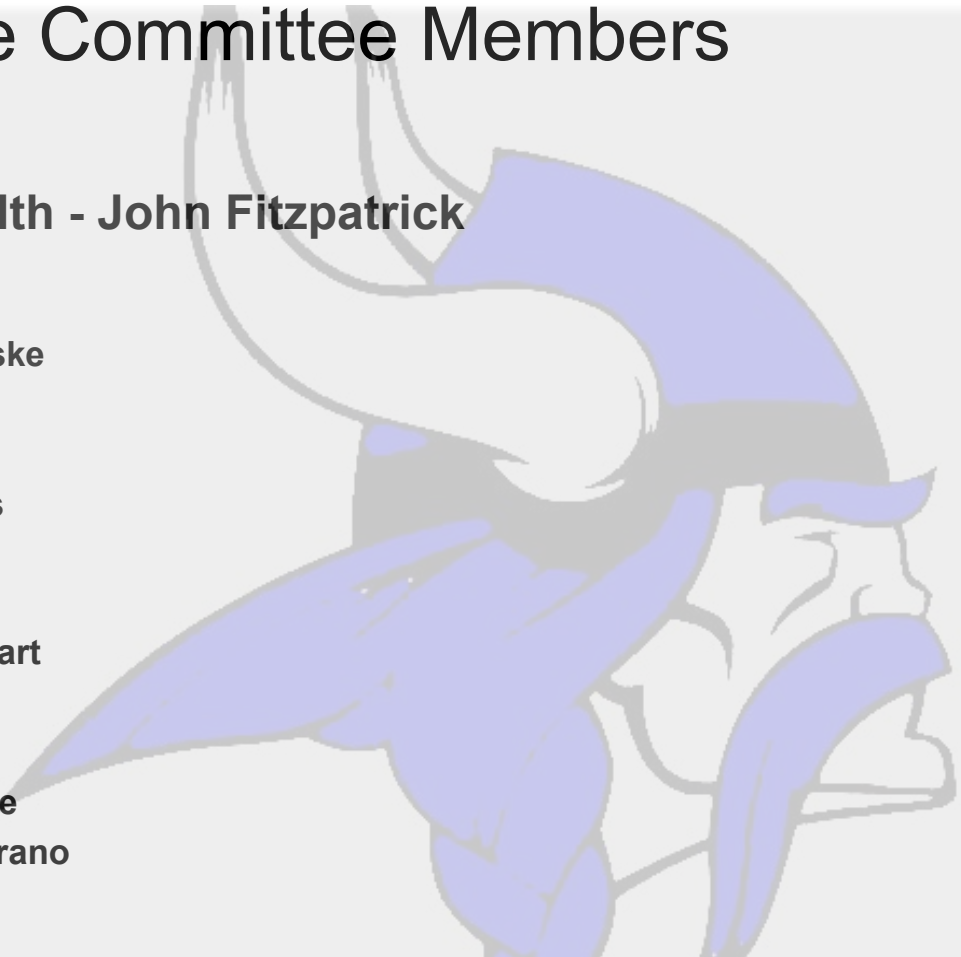
The District established 12 task force committees and met frequently in June and July to develop plans for the reopening of schools in September

# Formula for Reopening and for Closing Schools

*On July 13, 2020 Governor Andrew Cuomo announced that there will be a **formula** to decide the reopening of schools by region. For schools to be reopened, a region must be in Phase 4 and the infection rate in that region must be **under 5 percent**. If the rate goes above 9 percent, the schools will be closed. **For reopening, the state will look at a region's average infection rate over 14 days. For closing, the state will look at the average over a seven-day period.***

# Three Different Plans for Reopening

## Every District in NYS Must Develop 3 Plans for Reopening Schools

- **Plan A:** Minimal Social Distancing - 100% Students return in September
- **Plan B:** Moderate Social Distancing - Hybrid approach 50% Students return in September with 50% Distance Learning
- **Plan C:** Maximum Social Distancing - All Students Participate in Distance Learning



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

- The health and safety of the children and adults in our schools is paramount. Health and safety considerations must always come first in every decision made and every action taken by our district.
- Whether instruction is provided in-person, remotely, or through some combination of the two, **our district has an important role to play in educating and communicating with our community about the everyday preventive actions** that can be taken to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach  
50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

**Prevention** is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

- Health Checks;
- Healthy Hygiene Practices;
- Social Distancing;
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Cloth Face Coverings;
- Limiting the number of visitors on school grounds or in school facilities;
- Management of Ill Persons; and
- Cleaning and Disinfection.



## **Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

- **Health Checks** - We will follow the guidance from the NYSDOH and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as we work to keep an up to date list of symptoms of Coronavirus.
- **People with COVID-19 have a wide range of symptoms reported - ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus.**





**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

- **Health Checks** -
- As of 7/13/2020, the following are listed as the most common symptoms of COVID-19: ***Fever or chills (100°F or greater), Cough; Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; Fatigue; Muscle or body aches; Headache; New loss of taste or smell; Sore throat; Congestion or runny nose; Nausea or vomiting; and/or Diarrhea.***
- ***Students and staff exhibiting these signs should not come to school/work and if the symptoms are noticed at school the student or staff member will be sent to the school health office for an assessment by the school nurse and then sent home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

- **Health Checks** -

Other emergency warning signs include:

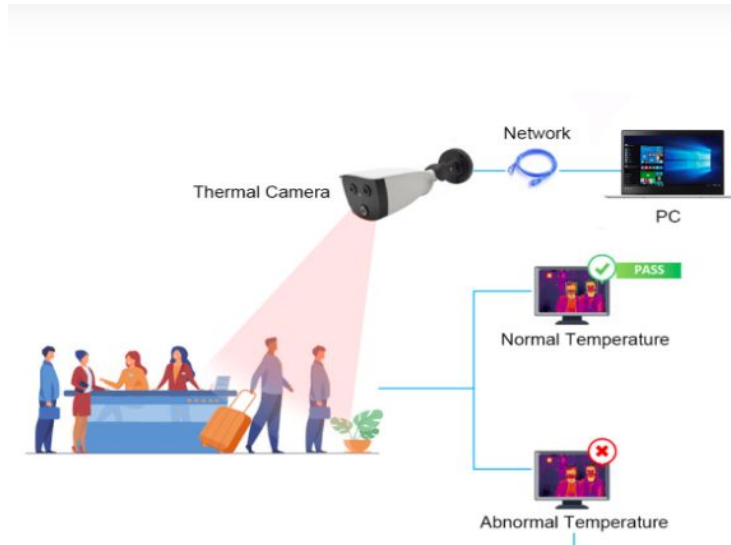
- **Trouble breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, inability to wake or stay awake, bluish lips or face.**
- ***Students and staff exhibiting these signs should not come to school/work and if the symptoms are noticed at school the student or staff member will be sent to the school health office for an assessment by the school nurse and then sent home.***



# Plan A and/or Plan B: 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

- **Health Checks** - We are investigating using a Thermal Temperature Scanner in each Nurse's Office
- We can set it up in the hallway outside the nurse's office or just inside their office.



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- *All parents/guardians will be required to perform a health screening prior to the child boarding a bus or being dropped off at school.*
- *A digital health screening form will be sent to or be available for all parents and guardians to complete each day.*



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Health Screenings:**

- *All employees will be required to perform a health screening prior to coming to work.*



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- ***The parent/guardian will be required to take their child's temperature and indicate if their child is fever free (less than 100 degrees). If the child has a temperature of 100 degrees or more...that child should remain at home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- ***All employees will be required to take their temperature prior to coming to work. If an employee has a temperature of 100 degrees or more...that employee should remain at home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- ***The parent/guardian will be required to indicate if their child is experiencing any flu-like symptoms such as respiratory distress; cough; fever; shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; fatigue; muscle or body aches; headache; new loss of taste or smell; sore throat; congestion or runny nose; nausea or vomiting; and/or diarrhea. If a parent can answer “YES” to any one of these symptoms, the child should stay home.***





**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- ***All employees will be required to indicate if they have experienced any flu-like symptoms such as respiratory distress; cough; fever; shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; fatigue; muscle or body aches; headache; new loss of taste or smell; sore throat; congestion or runny nose; nausea or vomiting; and/or diarrhea. If the employee can answer “YES” to any one of these symptoms, they should stay home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- ***The parent/guardian will be required to indicate if their child has been in contact, within the past 24 hours, with someone who is COVID-19 positive or awaiting test results for COVID-19. If a parent can answer “YES” to this item than the child should stay home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach  
50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- ***All employees will be required to indicate if they have been in contact, within the past 24 hours, with anyone who is COVID-19 positive or awaiting test results for COVID-19. If the employee can answer “YES” to this item than the employee should stay home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Health Screenings:**

- ***The parent/guardian will be required to indicate if their child or any member of their household is currently under active quarantine due to COVID-19 exposure. If the parent can answer “YES” to this item than they should keep their child home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Health Screenings:**

- ***All employees will be required to indicate if they or if any member the their household is currently under active quarantine due to COVID-19 exposure. If the employee can answer “YES” to this item than they should stay home.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Healthy Hygiene Practices** -

- **We will instruct students and staff in proper hand and respiratory hygiene and provide the necessary supplies.**
- **We will teach mask etiquette.**
- **We will teach proper hand washing and hand sanitizing etiquette.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### Healthy Hygiene Practices

- We will teach Social Distancing Etiquette



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Limiting the number of visitors** on school grounds or in school facilities;

- We will prohibit visitors from entering any and all buildings unless they have been screened and have an appointment.
- We will cancel Community Education and the Town Recreation Programs that are usually held in our buildings during August, September, October, November and December.





**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Cloth Face Coverings;**

- We will provide a cloth face covering as well as a disposable face covering for all faculty, staff and students.
- We will provide additional PPE such as face shields, N95 masks and other items as appropriate.



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Cloth Face Coverings;**

- ***Our students and staff must utilize face masks/coverings when they are not able to properly social distance of at least 6 feet or when not able to utilize appropriate physical barriers.***
- ***We will ensure that students and staff are protected by requiring at least one of the following: Social Distancing of Six Feet OR Barriers OR Face Masks/Coverings.***
- ***Students will be allowed to remove their cloth face coverings or masks for meals.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Cloth Face Coverings;**

- ***Students will be allowed to remove their cloth face coverings or masks, in order to take mask breaks, as long as they maintain proper social distancing.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Cloth Face Coverings;**

- ***Acceptable face coverings include but are not limited to cloth-based face coverings (e.g. homemade sewn, quick cut, bandana) and surgical masks that cover both the mouth and nose.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Social Distancing and Mask Requirements on Bus:**

- *All students are required to wear a mask and should maintain appropriate social distancing while riding a bus.*
- *The only exception to the mask requirement is that students whose physical or mental health would be impaired by wearing a mask would not be required to do so, but must maintain social distancing of 6 feet from other individuals on the bus.*



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Social Distancing and Mask Requirements on Bus:**

- *We are proposing changing the start and end times for school.*
- *We conducted a time study to determine the pros and cons to these changes.*
- *As long as students wear a mask while riding the bus we will also social distance as appropriate.*
- *Drivers will disinfect between runs.*

**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Cloth Face Coverings;**

- *The District will provide all Faculty, Staff and Students with a cloth face covering or mask.*
- *Parents are encouraged to provide a cloth covering or mask that is individualized to their child's interest or needs.*





**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Plastic Dividers and Barriers**

- ***The District will provide student desks, workstations and cafeteria tables with approved Plastic Dividers and Barriers.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Plastic Dividers and Barriers**

- ***The District will provide teacher desks and/or workstations with approved Plastic Dividers and Barriers.***



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Management of Ill Persons;**

- **The school district will provide information to educate all families, faculty and staff as to the signs and symptoms of the Covid-19 virus. The information will include directions on when to stay home if symptoms occur prior to school or if present in school to immediately report to the nurse.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Management of Ill Persons;**

- **Students/Faculty/Staff members who are presenting symptoms must report to the nurse before going home.**
- **Information communicated to families must be translated in their native language.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Management of Ill Persons;**

#### **Positive Temperature Reading, Sign of Illness**

- **If a student/staff member has a temperature above 100.0 degree and/or exhibits symptoms of the illness...**
  - **The student/staff member will be isolated in a designated area in the health office and have a face covering (if it does not restrict breathing).**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach  
50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Management of Ill Persons;**

- **For our Student - Parents will be notified immediately to pick up the child. If possible the student will be escorted to the parent's vehicle. If the student is out of school for more than four days, a doctor's note will be required to return to school.**
- **Faculty/Staff should be sent home immediately and required to provide a doctor's note if absent for more than four days.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach  
50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Management of Ill Persons;**

- **Any school in any community might need to implement short-term closure procedures regardless of community spread if an infected person has been in a school building. If this happens, CDC recommends the following procedures regardless of the level of community spread:**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach  
50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Management of Ill Persons;**

- **The District will coordinate with local health officials if an infected person has been in a school building.**
- **Once learning of a COVID-19 case in someone who has been in the school, we will immediately notify local health officials. These officials will help administrators determine a course of action.**





**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach  
50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Management of Ill Persons;**

- **If an infected person has been in a school building the CDC recommends that we dismiss students and most staff for 2-5 days. This initial short-term dismissal allows time for the local health officials to gain a better understanding of the COVID-19 situation impacting the school. This allows the local health officials to help the school determine appropriate next steps, including whether an extended dismissal duration is needed to stop or slow further spread of COVID-19.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

**Management of Ill Persons;**

- **If an infected person has been in a school building we will communicate with staff, parents, and students. This communication to the school community will align with the communication plan in the school's emergency operations plan. Our communication plan must maintain confidentiality of the student or staff member as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach  
50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Management of Ill Persons;**

- **If an infected person has been in a school building we clean and disinfect the building thoroughly. We will close off areas used by the individuals with COVID-19 and wait as long as practical before beginning cleaning and disinfection to minimize potential for exposure to respiratory droplets. Our staff will clean and disinfect all areas (e.g., offices, bathrooms, and common areas) used by the ill persons, focusing especially on frequently touched surfaces.**



## **Plan A and/or Plan B: 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning**

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Cleaning and Disinfecting;**

- **Hillyard will be supplying COVID job duty sheets for all cleaning areas.**
- **Each Classroom will have a Checklist that will be signed by the cleaning team each night.**
- **Each classroom will have a disinfectant station**
- **One spray bottle with Suprox (cleaner/disinfectant)**
- **Gloves**
- **Microfiber Cloths**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Cleaning and Disinfecting;**

- **By canceling in-person Community Education and in-person Town Recreation Programs in the months August, September, October, November and December we will also cancel 3rd shift cleaning and custodial work.**
- **Third shift personnel will be moved to second shift.**
- **Some second shift personnel will move to the first shift.**
- **These personnel moves will allow us to have cleaning teams available during school hours.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Cleaning and Disinfecting;**

- **Day time cleaning will include high touch areas such as door knobs, health office, and restrooms.**
- **Regularly monitoring of hygiene related materials in all restrooms (such as paper towels and soap dispensers)**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Cleaning and Disinfecting;**

- **All non-permanent classroom rugs will be removed from classrooms.**
- **All non-district furniture will be removed from classrooms.**
- **Hand sanitizing stations will be located throughout schools to optimize use.**
- **Protexus Cordless Electrostatic Sprayers will be in each building and utilized as needed.**
- **These devices use the PurTabs Disinfecting Tablets which allows the user to spray heavily soiled areas such as desks, door knobs, railings etc.**



**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **Building HVAC Systems;**

- **Building HVAC Systems**
  - **We will be doubling our outside air intake on all equipment where feasible.**
  - **Filtrations will be set at the highest MERV rate possible.**





**Plan A and/or Plan B:** 100% Students return in September and/or Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning

Prevention is accomplished by following the recommendations of health authorities in the following areas:

### **The Use of the Outdoors;**

- **We are considering purchasing tents for each school building.**
- **Shade Tree 20'x40' Heavy Duty, Fire Resistant, Event Tent w/Sidewalls**
- **Depending on cost, we may purchase 1 or 2 for each building and perhaps 3 for the high school.**
- **This will allow us to move PE and some other student activities to the outdoors on a regular basis.**

## **Plan B: Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning**

### **What does a Hybrid plan look like in each building?**

- One suggestion is to have **A/B Cohorts** of students divided by the alphabet.
- Students with the last name beginning with the letters A-L attend school 2 days (Mon-Thurs)...while the students with the last name beginning with the letters M-Z are home. Then the M-Z students who were home would attend for 2 days (Tues-Fri) while students with the last names beginning with A-L are home. Wednesday would be a day where all students are home.
- When any student is home, there will be teacher led directed instruction available everyday using Chromebooks and iPads.
- Wednesday also becomes a day for deep cleaning.

## **Plan B: Hybrid approach 50% Students in session with 50% Distance Learning**

### **What does a Hybrid plan look like in each building?**

- **Within the Hybrid model, when a student is home there will always be teacher led instruction available online. Teachers will use Google Classroom and have the ability to post instructional videos and assignments as appropriate.**
- **Since we are responsible for teaching all of the necessary content and standards within the curriculum, teaching and learning will occur each day.**
